My darling

Husband died yesterday morning at 5 o'clock. For the past five weeks he has been troubled with a pain in his chest lasting but a few minutes at a time. I did not think it was any thing serious until last week. Saturday about 4 P.M. he had a very hard one at the office. Sunday he had them at intervals through the day but still kept up & went down town twice. In the afternoon I sent for Dr Chase he staid until evening Edward was very cheerful read to me but said he thought the reading hurt him. We went to bed he apparently as well as ever

You will see what Mr Clark
says about Money to defray the
expenses of the coming Session if
the Draft come payable to the
order of Edward - Will you please
see that the money is in ready
in an available shape.

at two o'clock I was awake
by his groans & from that
time until he ^{died} suffered
terrible we got in Chase
there very soon but nothing
done any good - A minute
or so before he died he clasp
my hand & said he was
gone the he had gone into
another room - I stepped
to the door to speak to him

hard I ran back to him
he breathe but two or three
times and was gone and
here I am all broken to
pieces in this wide wide
world

I requested Mr Clark
to write to you this morning
he is perfectly competent &
Edward considered him
Honest. If it could be arranged

so that I could have it until
the January term it would
do me a great deal of good,
and leave some one in the
house with me until I get
little used to this great trouble.
